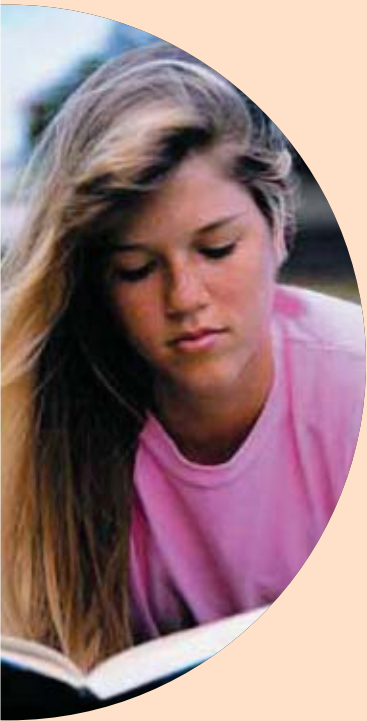

Assessment in the Differentiated Classroom

Assessment is much more than a test. This training takes teachers and administrators beyond standardized tests to explore the role and process of effective day-to-day assessment. Designed for teachers who already have a basic foundation in differentiated instruction, this training examines how to implement assessment in the classroom, offers a variety of assessment strategies, and explains what to do with assessment information. Issues related to grading will also be discussed.

Program Outline

Successful differentiated instruction is based on deliberate, prescriptive use of ongoing assessment. This one-day training is built on a four-step process that is central to successful classroom assessment. You'll learn about different types of assessments and how to use them to help students increase their achievement. You'll learn what pre-, formative, and summative assessments are and review numerous examples of each. You'll also explore the concept of mastery and discuss the complex issues of grading in a DI classroom.

Simply conducting an assessment is just one part of a larger process. First, you have to know why an assessment is needed. Then you have to know how to choose the right assessment, determine when to give it, and decide what actions you will take as a result. You will learn which questions to ask to successfully navigate these steps. You will examine how adjusting instruction and giving students feedback are critical components in making assessment useful. Plus, you will discover how making students partners in the assessment process increases their investment in their own learning.

Throughout the day there will be opportunities to apply what you are learning, ask questions, and exchange ideas with colleagues. You will gain the knowledge, understanding, and strategies you need to implement new assessment practices in your classroom and create new opportunities for your students' success.

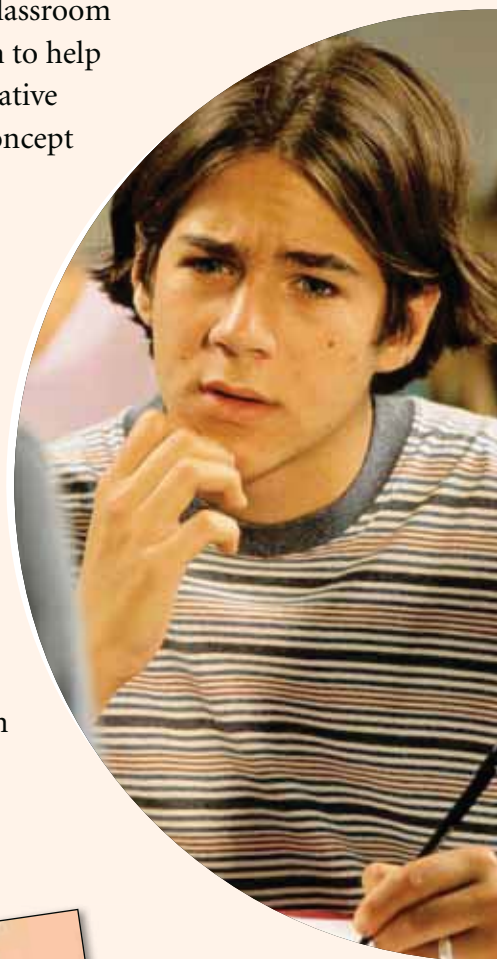
